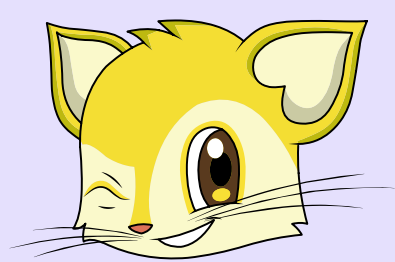
My dad - Zkriti – is named after the Zekreet area in the west of Qatar. He is known for his wisdom, love of life and tranquility.

We can't wait to see all the action starting from now and throughout the tournament.

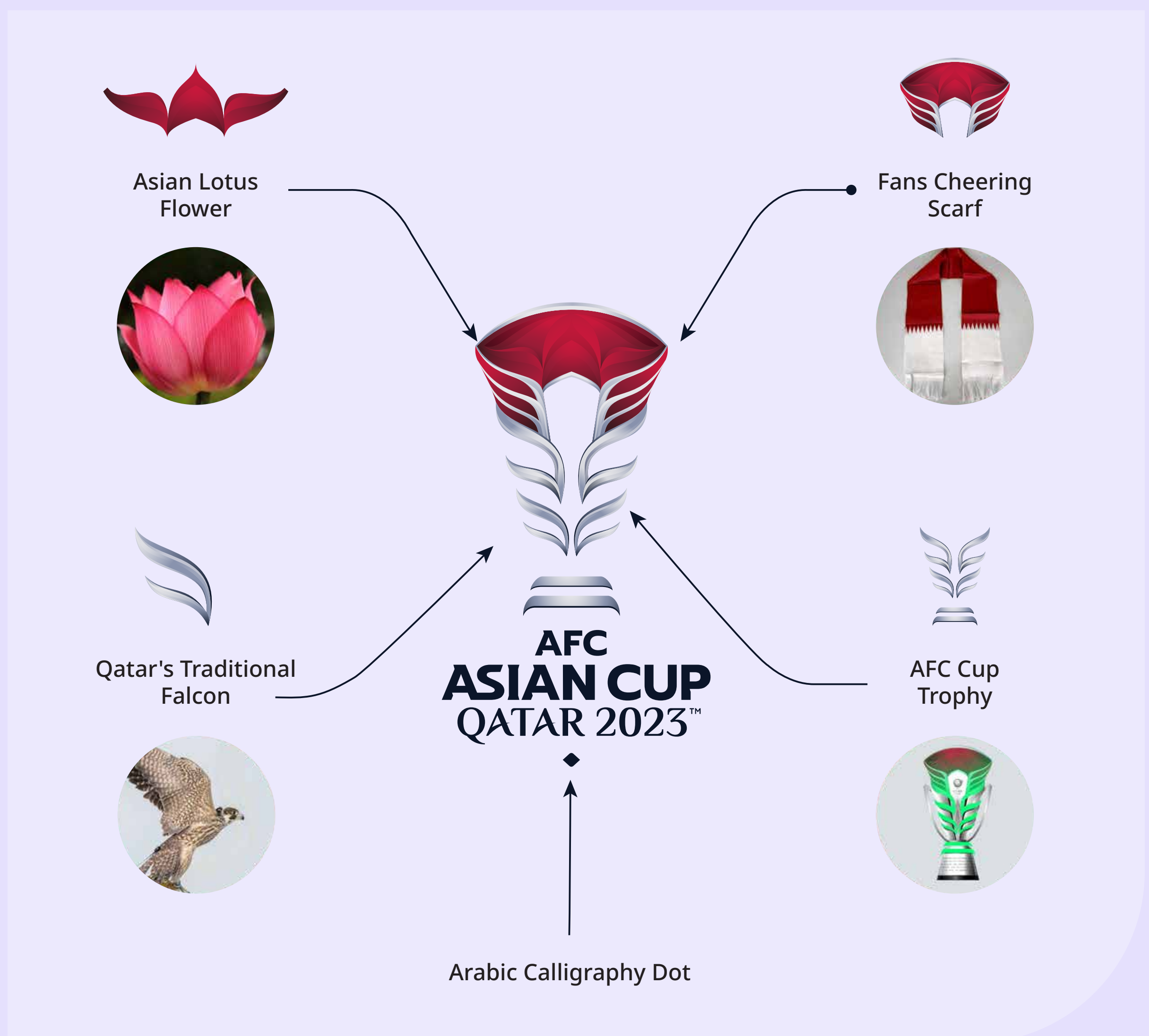


The Emblem
